Evergreens tour to Sicily 20th - 25th February 2014

It all started so well! 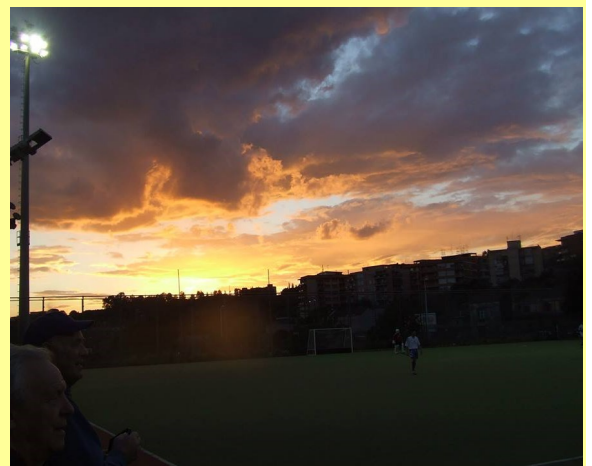
