

Lucy Wilde Earns Nomination for Essex Young Sports Star of the Year !

Chelmsford HC U14 girl Lucy Wilde has been nominated for the prestigious award of Essex Young Sports Star of the Year.

A member of the club for 5 years, Lucy has gone from strength to strength and represented each youth group through to her current level. She has also represented her county, as well as her school, Brentwood School, who nominated her for this award. She has taken her first steps into adult hockey playing a game each for the Ladies 4th and 5th XI's scoring a goal in each game. Her usual position is central midfield, and her general stamina allied to her growing skill level makes her an excellent team player.

Long standing coach, David 'Kitch' Kitchener, is quick to praise Lucy's achievements at the club to date: ""Lucy stood out as a special talent from when she first joined us in the Under 10s. She clearly had all the attributes to make a top hockey player then, and has continued to develop rapidly ever since. She still has a long way to go but I'm confident that she can achieve her ambitions.'

Outside of hockey, Lucy is also an exceptional netball player and was Centre in the Brentwood School team which won the National U13 Cup which is also nominated as one of the Essex Young Teams Of the Year. She plays club netball for Chelmsford and also represents Essex. Lucy has also participated in several athletics events for school and currently competes as a hurdler, middle distance runner and javelin eventer as well as a member of the sprint relay team. During the winter she performed well at several cross-country competitions for school and she was Year 8 Girl's Swimming Captain for the 2013/14 season.

Sport is a big part of Lucy's life and as well as hoping to emulate some of the currently successful England hockey and netball players and go on to represent her country, Olympian Jess Ennis is Lucy's role model. From the younger generation of athletes the one she'd like to emulate is fellow track and field athlete, Katarina Johnson-Thomson.
