## Welcome

### Editors

This issue has been published a bit later than we would have liked, as there are only a few games left of the season (for most teams) but hopefully what lies within will be of interest to you.

The next issue (and our last as editors - any volunteers?) will be out just before the annual AGM, so sometime in early/mid June, following the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> XI season.

It has been a mixed season so far for the club as a whole. The Ladies 1<sup>st</sup> XI have exceeded the (very high) expectations that they seem to demand from themselves: they are just outside the outdoor play-off top 4 (but with high hopes), semi-finalists in the HA Cup, undefeated Indoor Champions (again) and provider of three Commonwealth Games athletes, as well as numerous other honours! The flip-side is that the Men's 1<sup>st</sup> XI are struggling to stay in the top flight, they withdrew from the National Indoor League and have been knocked out of the EH Cup, albeit to Cannock in a very very tight match (see report later).

Whilst the Ladies' club sides are doing well (the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI are through to the semi-finals of the EH 2<sup>nd</sup> XI Cup), the Men's club sides are, on the whole, struggling following an excellent season last year. Off the pitch the club seems to be going through a general malaise (see Bar Burlings), whether this is due to the lack of 1<sup>st</sup> XI games we'll only know next season.

Having said that the season isn't over yet. We are the host to a variety of events (see Secretary's Corner) which we hope to be successful and enjoyable, and



also there is the resumption of the Premier League - and a few very important make-or-break (for both XI's) games/weekends.

## **Sponsorship and Marketing**

It has been a busy time for the Club, with substantial coverage in the local and regional media in the past few weeks. Much of it has been based around the Ladies success in the Indoor League and at the National Indoor Championships, but, more recently, the Commonwealth Games has been the focus of attention.

Ladies Captain, Lisa Wooding, was featured in March's edition of Essex Life, with a two-page spread covering her busy life, but

with a strong theme of hockey throughout. Whilst it was very much about Lisa, it was also tremendous coverage for the Club (as well as the game), and followed up on a similar feature last year.

There is a further planned shoot in a couple of months, this time with Chloe Rogers and Hayley Heggie as the subjects. For those wondering why we have featured the Ladies so much recently, there are other reasons apart from the obvious ones.

First, whilst these articles and news items are very much about the individuals or the teams (and their successes), a constant theme is Chelmsford Hockey Club, which helps to boost its profile in many valuable ways and ultimately benefits all sections of the Club. Therefore, on the basis that all publicity is good publicity for Chelmsford Hockey Club, we shall continue to do so.


Second, and more importantly, the Ladies 1<sup>st</sup> team have fully 'bought in' to the concept of marketing, not only for their benefit, but also for the wider benefit mentioned above. Be aware that it means already busy people giving up time and putting in effort to make these things happen (it doesn't just magically take place – there is a terrific amount of organisation involved), but the rewards are there for all to see.

This keeps the Club very much in the headlines, which is a key factor in recruiting new players, attracting new sponsors (and fulfilling our agreements with current ones), as well as promoting the sport of hockey (in competition, as it is, with many

other sports, for young newcomers). So this type of publicity is open to any and all of the other areas of the Club, but requires a similar commitment (buying into marketing) from all involved to ensure it is equally as successful. We are certain there are regular equally newsworthy stories all around the Club, but we can only bring them to light with your help.

Returning to the coverage, apart from the TV exposure of the actual event by Sky TV, both BBC Look East and Anglia TV ran with news items on the Indoor Championships at peak hours during the following week, with an audience reach of around one million each. On radio, BBC Essex, Essex FM and Breeze FM followed the story, while the local papers across the county and the region gave excellent exposure. It was even featured in Park Life, a 15,000 household magazine distribution in North Chelmsford.

In mid-March, with the Commonwealth Games imminent, three Chelmsford players (Lisa, Hayley and Pixie) and Jo Ellis from Ipswich were the subject of a lengthy news article on BBC Look East, whilst Chloe took advantage of family connections to be interviewed separately by her brother, a journalist with the same organisation. Photos of that filming session, taken by Paul Robins, of club sponsor Shutterspark, will appear on the



website.

While on the topic of Paul, using his professional services as a sports and events photographer has been instrumental in getting a lot of these news items more coverage than otherwise might happen. The printed media all work on the principle of "one picture is worth a thousand words", making any article come alive, especially if the photo is an 'action' one (not the standard 'mug-shot' or team photo).

So, if you are planning an event, such as a wedding or a christening, and are thinking of hiring a photographer, think about rewarding Paul for all the hard work that he does on the Club's behalf and use his services. He has an on-line gallery at his website (which you'll find via ours) and I am sure will be happy to provide you with a quote.

Finally, I'd draw your attention to our website statistics which were published on the site, showing 30,000 hits in the month of February. No doubt, a lot of the interest arose from the Indoor success, but it is also something to build on. The website is something we can all be very proud of (and congratulations must continue to go to Tufty and his team of volunteers) – not only it is a fantastic community forum for the Club but it is a platform for marketing ourselves (and, once again, the sport).

In the Sponsorship section, there are now full details on a variety of sponsorship opportunities, along with down-loadable application forms. This gives every

member the ability to act as a salesperson for the Club, whether amongst family, friends, at work or with business acquaintances. There is a vast range of opportunities to suit every pocket, from £10 (for the Ladies European campaign) to £15,000 (to underwrite the Schools Initiative). All it needs is your determined and continuous commitment to do something about it.

## Men's First XI Report

There hasn't been a lot of action on the Men's 1<sup>st</sup> XI front since the last newsletter so below is the match report from their only game since Christmas - the cup

tie with Cannock.

### **Chelmsford 3 v 3 Cannock (aet)**

Cannock win 6 v 4 on penalty strokes

Chelmsford came within a whisker of a major upset in the English Hockey Cup as they narrowly lost out to double winners Cannock on penalty strokes on Sunday. A thrilling game saw Chelmsford come back from two goals down in the first half to give the holders a huge scare and nearly inflict their first defeat of the season.

Despite missing several international stars, Cannock started the game as overwhelming favourites. Chelmsford, though, refused to be overawed, and ignored their underdog status to take the game to the visitors. However, they failed to create any clear-cut chances and, halfway through the first period, appeared to be punished as Cannock scored twice in four minutes. Firstly, former GB international Andy West deflected home a short corner at the far post to give his side the advantage, before the same player doubled his side's lead when he latched onto a loose ball to lift the ball over Chelmsford goalkeeper Adrian Kimber.

Having suffered two crushing league defeats to Cannock already this season, Chelmsford could have been forgiven for fearing the worst. On previous occasions, Chelmsford's heads may have fallen, but this time they continued to drive forward as they tried to force their way back into the game. They were duly rewarded when an Adam Hunter penalty corner deflection a minute before the break sailed past the

Cannock defence to bring the home side back into contention.

The second half continued at the same pace as the first, as both sides looked to exert their authority on the game, but, despite several half chances at either end, neither side looked as if they would add to the score line. However, just as it seemed Cannock were coasting into the quarter-finals, the game burst into life. Luke Mepham brought Chelmsford back on to level terms with just seven minutes remaining when he steered a Dave de Prez pass into the roof of the net at a penalty corner. As Chelmsford looked to win the game in the dying minutes, they were left outnumbered at the back as Cannock broke down the flank and forced a short corner. Although Kimber saved the initial effort, another ex-GB player, Andy Humphrey, squeezed the rebound under the keeper's glove to regain the lead for Cannock.

Chelmsford, though, were not to be deterred and soon swarmed on the Cannock goal. To the elation of the home crowd, they were duly rewarded when the rejuvenated penalty corner team made light of the absence of Gareth Carr to lay the ball off for Jon Wilcox to sweep the ball home and send the game into extra time.

As the extra period was played out, fatigue crept into the legs of both sides, and chances became scarcer in front of both goals. The one real chance of extra time came at a Chelmsford penalty corner when de Prez's slip flew agonisingly past the outstretched stick of Mepham with the goal at his mercy.



The final whistle saw the prospect of penalty strokes, but in the end it was not to be Chelmsford's day as Hunter and Josh Mepham's weak efforts were saved and Wilcox put his attempt against the post. Despite de Prez scoring Chelmsford's fourth stroke and two penalty saves by Kimber, Cannock held their nerve to advance to the last eight of the competition.

After the game, Chelmsford player coach Dave de Prez was pleased with his side's display.

"The guys can be rightly proud of their performance today against the top side in the country. If we can take this level of effort and determination into the remainder of the season then there is a real chance of avoiding relegation."

Chelmsford do not return to action until May when they look to overturn a run of results that sees them sitting at the bottom of the English Premier League.


