Club Kit

After a period of consultation in the early part of the season, over the Christmas period and into the New Year, we have been requesting proposals for the provision of match kit and sports leisurewear from a variety of suppliers. The idea is to introduce one supplier to the Club that can provide a comprehensive range of clothing, on and off the pitch, at competitive (i.e. cheaper) prices, creating a common Club identity but with the possibility of some variation within that so that teams or sections within the Club can have their own identity in terms of after-match wear.

In the end, a formal request for proposal was sent to five suppliers, incorporating a list of clothing and ancillary items drawn up from suggestions by many people across the Club. Not only did we want to know about prices, but also delivery times, quality, design, minimum orders and so on.

Three of those companies replied with a proposal after a period of one month and a report, along with an evaluation and recommendations, was sent to the Management Committee for their meeting on February 8th. By the time this article is published, you may well have an idea of who was chosen.

Without pre-empting the MC, it was very clear that many people would be unhappy with dipping into their pockets so soon after buying Kookaburra kit, so it was important to emphasise that the only difference to the playing kit designs would be the suppliers

logo. In this way, there will be no radical changes, as has happened before, and the complete transformation over to one supplier will happen naturally as people replace their old playing kit. One idea did come up, however, and this is subject to the MC's approval. That is to allow teams to choose a different material to the 'performance' material used at the top end of the Club, with a slightly variation on design. This would probably suit Veteran and Junior teams more, but may be open to any group, provided they agree to do it as a unit. Just an idea, as I said, at this stage and subject to approval.

What will be more interesting is the range of clothing that we have chosen, again after consultation with representatives from across the Club. And, again taking consultation, we have designed a new logo for the Club which could take the place of the badge on after-match wear, leaving people happy to wear the stuff any time, anywhere not just at the weekends and at the Club.

Watch out for more details and advertisements on the notice boards or on the Website later in the month/in early March.

Men's First XI Report

The Men's 1st XI had a somewhat mixed first half of the season.

Currently 7th in the league, the side are only 4 points away from 4th in the league, one point away from their desired finish of top 6 but only goal difference away from a play-off position of 9th.

The season was never going to have the easiest start, playing the entire top five from the previous season in the first six games. To come away with 4 points was certainly creditable, particularly as those came from victories against Hampstead and a draw against Surbiton. There were also very tense games against Reading (1-1 when Duppers had a reverse stick thunderbolt hit a defenders hand on the line, even though he did not see the ball) and Cannock (2-0 up at half time) who were quoted in The Daily Express as saying it was their hardest game of the season to date. The disappointments were that the side ONLY drew with Surbiton despite having by far the best of the chances and the 4-3 defeat to Firebrands.

The second quarter was also a bit of a roller coaster with a sequence going win, lose, win, lose, win. The 3-0 victory over Guildford was certainly a high point. The game was delayed by over two hours due to a frozen section of the pitch. However, Chelmsford managed to maintain their concentration, with goals from Ned and Phil Sully twice sealing the victory. The other two victories were the 7-1 and 7-0 drubbings of St Albans and Teddington, of which coach Ned must be delighted as to the professionalism with which the games were approached.

The second quarter low points were the 6-3 defeat at home to Old Loughts and the 5-2 defeat to

Canterbury. In both games the side never really got into the game and lost concentration at crucial moments – something it was possible to get away with the previous season but not so this. Part of the problem may have been down to a small injury crisis which meant that Hunts (hamstrung) and Gugs (bottom) were both unable to train for large parts of the season. It also ensured Fizz was kept more than a little busy.

The second half of the season has started with a bang, as friendly defeats of Canterbury and Beeston lead the side into their first league game against Surbiton. A 2-1 victory ensured the side were putting a little run together – long may it continue!

Gugs is currently our top scorer with 8 goals to his name. He will be hoping for more opportunities from corners in the second half. Hot on his trail though are Phil Sully (6 all open play – 6th best in the league), Dupperts with 6 and Jonny Wilcox with 4. The further good news is that Ned is also beating Natalie by 3 goals to 2!! The addition of Thornton McDade to the side in November, also added serious pace to the front line.

At the back Adrian Kimber has pulled off some outstanding saves (the most notable one was the 2-1 defeat of Surbiton). Will Hales has shown off his skills at left back and Gugs has been throwing aerials most of the length of the pitch, giving the side an awesome counter attack threat.

The side are mainly on the road in the second half, with only two home games left (Reading on 6th March and Guildford on 3rd

April). Your support is, as always, very much appreciated, and both games will give an opportunity to watch some high quality internationals on both sides! From the entire side, can I thank all of you that turn out to support the side whenever you can. This really does mean a lot to the side. To those who have thought about coming to support, how often are you able to see Olympic athletes for free? While the side is on the road, you can keep up to date with Kitch's reports on the website and the Essex Chronicle.

Indoors

The indoor season never really promised too much with trips to South Africa, India, Dominican Republic, and the US meaning practice and availability was severely limited. It wasn't too much of a surprise, therefore, when every player at one time or another used an outdoor skill (the flip over the stick being the most common). However, the side did show at times their indoor potential. Luke Mephram scoring six against Yeovil being an obvious example. There were also impressive performances from Josh Mephram on debut. As always, the performances improved throughout the tournament, and the second half of their final game against Havant was won 7-3 (shame it was 5-1 down at half time). The side ended 6th, thus avoiding relegation, but ensuring they could not escape from their usual mid-table position.

The side should hope to build upon these performances for next year, when a longer pre-season and far better availability will hopefully see the side push for

promotion to the Premier League.

Ladies First XI Report

Our final League game is at home on 16th April - League rules state that all League games will start at noon and it could be crucial ! It will co-incide with Club Day so please help us win with your support.

The 2nd XI are continuing their improvement under coach Nat Fulton and are now in contention at the right end of the table, looking for a top 3 finish, which would be an incredible achievement for the region's premier 2nd XI team.

Despite the last minute selection nightmares that are (unfortunately) becoming more a problem this season, the 3rd XI (as you'll be able to read later) are having a dream season, not since the great Arsenal team of, err..., 2003/04 have a team gone unbeaten for the season. Alas it wasn't to be, a recent defeat at the hands of last year's nemesis team, Southend, put pay to their 100% winning record but a minor miracle would stop them from achieving (some would say, a long overdue) promotion to Division 2S.

Men's Team Reports

The Men's 2nd XI this year have undergone a few changes in both management and playing personnel. New signings include Richard Skilton and Jimmy Smith

After an unsettled start to our Prem A campaign we went on to form a closely knitted side that has had a 9 game winning streak this season. Victories include an away win against League leaders Ipswich (0-3) and a home win against long time rivals Crostyx (5-1). Both games meant a ot more than just three points as Ipswich hadn't lost up to that point and haven't dropped another point since and I personally have never beaten Crostyx before so to beat them in the way did was a real achievement for all involved.

It looks like we are going to finish the season in our highest ever League position and I believe this is largely thanks to our coach Natalie Fulton. Natalie has got us playing as a team and working for each other which is evident in the success we've had and will hopefully be seen in future results.

Thanks to all who have supported us so far and please continue to show your love for the Men's 2nd XI as we draw a close to the season.

Derek Gould (Men's 3rd XI)

The 3rd team this year has been all about spirit and fight. 15 wins from 15 games is not down to one person alone. What? Yes it is. I hear you say. Surely it can't all be down to the captain this year and his infamous "3 second rule". More about that later!

The magnificent achievement is down to an incredible team effort.

Let's look at the stats so far. A total of 28 players have had the honour of playing with the 3rd team this season. From those 28, we've had 17 of them scoring a grand total of 84 goals. That's 3 per player (if we'd all scored) and 5.6 goals per game.

There have been 4 goalkeepers attributing to the loss of 19 goals or should we be putting this down to the defenders? Either way, 19 goals have passed our goal tenders. Adrian Ericsson has the best record: 1 game, 1 clean sheet, 100%. Next up is Tim Briggs with 11 games, 11 goals and 3 clean sheets – 27%.
